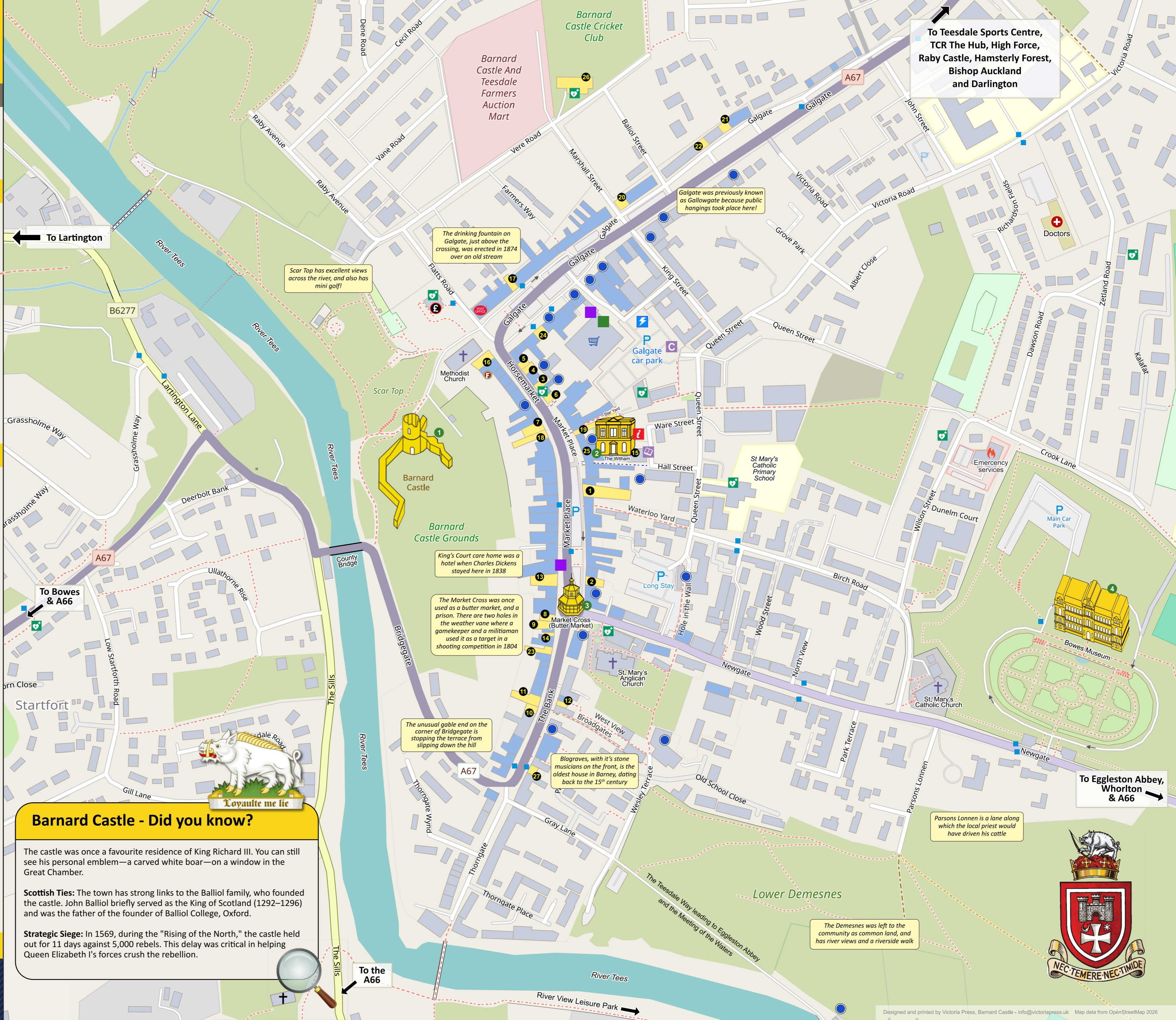

Barnard Castle - Did you know?

The castle was once a favourite residence of King Richard III. You can still see his personal emblem—a carved white boar—on a window in the Great Chamber.

Scottish Ties: The town has strong links to the Balliol family, who founded the castle. John Balliol briefly served as the King of Scotland (1292–1296) and was the father of the founder of Balliol College, Oxford.

Strategic Siege: In 1569, during the "Rising of the North," the castle held out for 11 days against 5,000 rebels. This delay was critical in helping Queen Elizabeth I's forces crush the rebellion.
